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# Section 1 Politics among Scales



### Scale and Power Geometry

What is important in thinking about the relationship between scale and politics is that the politics of adjustment of interests or execution of power does not always deploy the same scale to the base, and constitutes mutual interaction and deployment between differing scales.








### 1. Deviating from state borders

- (1) Hollowing out: The role of the state is hollowing out and coming to be shared with other actors.
- Pilling in (Jones, Goodwin, Jones, and Pett 2005): New roles are filling in the new scales.


