General submission requirements

Please include your name, affiliation, e-mail address and ORCID iD in the manuscript.

Requirement	Instruction
Font type	Times New Roman
Font size	12
Spelling	UK spelling
Reference style	APA (see the examples below)
Abstract	Required
Keywords	Required
Footnotes	Avoid; use in-text citations instead
Headings	Do not number headings

Headings, quotations, figures and tables

- Use **bold** for major headings and *italics* for subheadings.
- Titles of headings with capitalized first letters.
- Quotations → use **quotation marks** and *italics*
- Figures, Tables → indicate the source



Article types and length

Article type	Length
Research Article	40,000–60,000 characters, including spaces
Policy-Debate Article	No strict word limit
Report Article	No strict word limit
Book Review Essay	Around 3,000 words

In-text citations:

- One author → (Medeiros, 2000, p. XXX)
- Two authors → (Mertens & Unfried, 2022, p. XXX-XXX)
- Three authors → (Paül, Vila-Lage & Trillo-Santamaría, 2022, p. XXX)
- Many authors → (Medeiros et al. 2024, p. XXX)
- More in-text citations from different authors, they should be **lined up in alphabetical order** and **separated by semicolons** → (Medeiros, 2000; Medeiros et al. 2024; Mertens & Unfried, 2022; Paül, Vila-Lage & Trillo-Santamaría, 2022)
- More in-text citations from the same author, they are **separated by commas and the publication year is marked by “abc” signs** → (Hobson 2007a, 2007b, 2007c, 2012, 2013)
- More in-text citations from the same author and from different authors → (Hobson 2007a, 2007b; Medeiros, 2000; Medeiros et al. 2024)

Reference list general guidelines:

- Use alphabetical order.
- Names containing Jr or II should be listed as follows:
Author Last Name, Initials, Jr. (year).
Author Last Name, Initials, II (year).

If DOI is available, always include it.
